
aspiring opera soprano Ayanna Freelon,

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## **CAAPA Opera Composer's Project August 2021**

The CAAPA Opera Composer's event took place at National Harbor's Arts'tination venue after the World Premiere viewing of "Till the Wind Gets Right" with scenes from "Lyrics of Sunshine and Shadows" located on the Big Screen at the National Harbor's Plaza. The film by composer and librettist Stephen M. Allen was a first of it's kind, an operatic documentary of sorts we like to call a docuopera based on the lives and love of Paul Laurence Dunbar and Alice Ruth



Moore. The event was followed by a reception at Arts'tination, managed by PGAHC on Waterfront Street at the Harbor. Allen's work was featured in a showcase competition highlighting a series of three 20-minute opera segments, conceived and written by Black



opera composers including Scott Patterson (Afro Punk Ballet), team Jasmine Barnes and Joshua Banbury (The Illustrator), and Allen's (Lyrics of Sunshine and Shadows: An Opera Based on the Lives and Love of Paul Laurence Dunbar and Alice Ruth Moore). The results of the adjudicated

showcase the fall prior to the pandemic was part of a two-year endeavor to help promote Black composers from the Maryland, Northern Virginia, and District of



Columbia region, resulting in winning composer Allen being awarded \$20,000.00 to mount segments of his original opera. The American composer uniquely explored and captured the life of Dunbar in an ongoing array of operatic works based his love of the poet called "The Dunbar Operas. His "walk with Dunbar" has been an extraordi-

narily rich one, and his works have been featured on stage, television and in concert. He represents CAAPA debuting brand new scenes, representing a significant move forward for the county in the journey with new, expanded iteration of opera by Black composers.





A growing trend and part of the nouveau renaissance of diversity, inclusion, and access, the project was conceived by District #8 based organization, CAAPA whose mission is "Bringing Color to the Classics!®" and considered by many to be among the go-to organizations of color for diversity in the classical music and opera world, hopes to bring the first Opera House to the county. The non-

profit also presents concerts, recitals, and events throughout the region in support youth and scholarship programs. It is also the hope, with additional funding, to eventually present Banbury, Barnes, and Patterson's operatic works in the county. CAAPA's longstanding relationship and support with PGAHC speaks to the commitment funding agencies now have in order to ensure exposure on a wider platform with a goal of featuring Black classical musicians, opera singers, as well as composers of color.

Soprano Carmen Balthrop has died at the age of 73. Born in Maryland, the soprano went on to win the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions and made her Met debut in 1977 as
